From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

In his homily on this Feast, January 6th, 1979, Blessed Pope John Paul II, said:

"The Epiphany is the feast of God's challenge!"

The Magi Kings, saw the star, knew of the prophecy, but more importantly, felt the call of Faith. Even though they were of a different belief, culture and language, they honestly pursued the call of God in their hearts toward Him. They followed the star to the Christ Child, wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in a manger. This same openness of heart to God and His Will in their lives, enabled them to see this poor, ordinary looking child with eyes of Faith; ". . . they saw the Child with Mary His mother, and they fell down and worshiped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered Him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh." (Matthew 2:11-12) It is easier to understand how the Shepherds were able to see the Truth of the Christ Child. They, too, were Jewish, lived in the area, were poor and used to humble surroundings and the smell of animals. But the Magi Kings were educated, wealthy and accustomed to more noble surroundings. How could they bow down and worship anyone who lived in these circumstances; any child that would have to be born in this kind of poverty.

We too are challenged by God to believe in Him. To believe all that He has revealed about Himself, His Son, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. We are challenged to believe that this ordinary piece of bread is God, Himself, so that we too, fall down and worship Him. Bringing Him our gifts, putting our possessions of time, talent and treasure at His feet to be used by Him for His work.

Let us ask Mary, His Mother, to pray that we too might receive and answer this daily challenge of Faith.

Epiphany Home Blessing

"Epiphany" means "manifestation" and is the celebration of Jesus' manifestation and His glory as Savior to all nations symbolically through the Magi. Epiphany is also a day to share gifts, feast, and bless homes. **This Sunday**, you can do this home blessing. (The letters stand for "Christ Bless this Home" in Latin and for the names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.)

All make the Sign of the Cross.

Head of Household: "Peace be to this house and: to all who dwell here, in the name of the Lord.

All: Blessed be God forever.

Reader: In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be..... And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. (John 1:1-3.14) Using chalk, write above an entrance: **20+C+M+B+13 All:** Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only

All: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. May we be blessed



with health, goodness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.


