





#### **MARCH FOR LIFE ON JANUARY 22**

Roe Memorial Events will take place **Saturday**, **January 22**, **2011**—marking the 38th anniversary of the tragic Roe v. Wade U.S. Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion in America. These events are in memory of the more than 51 million babies who have died, and in prayer for the mothers and fathers who have been hurt by abortion.

St. John parishioners will carpool to this event, leaving the church parking lot at 7:45 am, since the Cathedral fills quickly. The Mass begins at 10:00 am with Joe Languell providing music. At 12:00 noon the March for Life proceeds to the Earl Cabell Federal Courthouse where Roe v. Wade was originally filed. The police-escorted March is peaceful, prayerful and family friendly with a rally beginning at 12:45. Marchers return to the Cathedral at 1:30 pm for cookies and hot chocolate. For those who cannot march, Eucharistic Adoration will take place in the Cathedral.
