Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Our Responsorial Psalm this weekend is the first line from Psalm 27. The Psalmist sings, "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom should I fear?" The following line reads, "The Lord is my life's refuge; of whom should I be afraid?"

These two lines are strong reminders of how we as Catholic Christians are to go about our lives in this world of sin. We are to live our lives according to the teaching of Christ and His Church. We are to live, unafraid. We are to live, without fear.

Our Faith, the lives of the Saints, testify that our Lord will be faithful and protect us from evil being victorious in our lives. Jesus suffered, died and rose from the dead to guarantee our victory over evil. By our Baptism we are given the power to be victorious over evil.

Our lives as Catholic Christians are to be imitations of the life of Jesus of Nazareth. We need to meditate on the life of Jesus by reading the Gospels in order to have a clear and realistic view of what our own lives are to be like. Too many times we just have a mental image of what we want our lives to be rather than a realistic expectation based on the truth of Scripture, the teaching of the Church and the lives of the Saints. We need to keep ourselves grounded in truth by constantly building a foundation upon Scripture and the Saints.

If God spoke to a coach and his football team declaring their victory in the upcoming game, what would the coach and players expect? I believe they would realistically expect the final score of the game to declare them the winners of the game. But would they expect the game to be played without the other team ever scoring? Would they expect that none of their players would be tackled? Would they expect that no player on their team would suffer injury? Would they expect that they wouldn't be tired and sore at the end of the game? Would they expect that at no point during the game would the opposing team be ahead in scoring?

No, I believe that their realistic expectation would be the victory at the end of the game. This is the same with our lives as Catholics. Our life here on earth will include suffering, disappointment, injury, betrayal and all the other effects of sin that were present during the earthly life of Jesus of Nazareth. The victory is eternal life in Heaven after our earthly life has been completed. The final victorious score is well worth the difficulty of the game! As St. Paul writes, "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us." (Romans 8:18)

Saint Methodius

- Born between 815 and 820
- Went into Imperial Administration
- Put in charge of one of the frontier provinces
- Around 840 retired to monastery at foot of Mount Olympus


Saint Cyril

- Born 827 or 828
- Entered priesthood
- Became Librarian of the Archive of Hagia Sophia
- Became Secretary to the Patriarch of Constantinople
- Retired to a monastery on the Black Sea coast
- 6 months later, convinced to teach Philosophy in Constantinople
 – Earned title "the Philosopher"
- Sent by the emperor and patriarch on a mission to the Saracens
- Went to join Methodius to be a monk

Saints Cyril and Methodius

- Sent as religious and cultural experts on delegation to Khazars
- They find Pope Saint Clement's relics at Kherson in the Crimea and take them with them
