From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Saint Paul challenges us and the Corinthians this Sunday to love as God loves; which means to become like God, because St. John tells us that "God is love."

In fact, Saint Paul informs us that all knowledge we might have, all the work we might do, if not accomplished in love of God does not accomplish or truly gain anything! It is like the clash of a cymbal; it makes noise, but is then gone, it does not last. It does not accomplish a "true good" which lasts into eternity.

For example, if we organized a secular, humanitarian effort and fed all the hungry of the world, without feeding the image of God, we see in each person, we would not accomplish a "true good." Like Jesus, Himself told the woman at the well, that she just has to keep coming back to the well, over and over again to satisfy her thirst. However, the water that He gives will satisfy her need forever.

We could come to a person suffering from a severe/painful bacterial infection and give them aspirin to lower the fever, cold cloths to make them more comfortable and pain killers to stop the pain. However, until we give them the proper antibiotic to kill the bacteria and truly cure them, we have only treated the symptoms and not the disease itself. They will not be cured of the disease and will eventually die.

The charity that we are called to practice, the life we are to live, is the bringing of Christ to each and every person we meet, because we have "become Christ," by eating His flesh and drinking His blood. As Saint Paul says, "It is no longer I that live, but Christ that lives in me." He always arrives patient, kind, not jealous, humble, selfless, compassionate, cheerful, excited, hopeful and ready to stay as long as we need Him.

Quite the daily checklist for ourselves! Good thing Lent is right around the corner, followed by Easter!




