† Pastor's Notes

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

This Sunday we hear another exciting episode from the Book of the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus Christ! Week after week, it never ends, the love and mercy of our God toward each one of us personally and all peoples. It is worth the effort to put ourselves in the place of the folks who witnessed this compassionate miracle of Jesus. Living in this time they were fully aware of the horrible nature of this terrible illness of leprosy. Even the Mosaic Law, as we heard in our first reading, prescribes strict and harsh treatment of those poor souls affected by leprosy. They must not approach other people, they must warn others of their presence by crying out, "unclean." How terrible and humiliating a life of leprosy would have been. This terrible life did not end until death. There was no cure for this disease. This leper had obviously heard of Jesus, he had opened his heart to the gift of faith and believed that Jesus could heal him. He sought Jesus out, knelt down and begged Jesus to take away this dreadful life he was living. What did the people think who were nearby? Why had this man, Jesus, allowed the leper to come close to him? Why did the leper break the law and come close enough to Jesus to speak with him? This disease of leprosy had so messed up his life that it was worth any risk or humiliation if there was a chance of being healed. It was this unclean disease that ruined every part of his life.

The Church Fathers have always viewed this disease of leprosy as a symbol of mortal sin in a person's life. The presence of mortal sin takes away the true peace, joy, and love in our life. It is at the foundation of all that hurts us. We need to recognize this and seek out Jesus in the Confessional. We need to beg Him to heal us and restore us to a good life. Even though we are unclean, and many people would not want to get near us, Jesus will "stretch out his hand and touch us!" He will always respond to our repentance and heal us. As the priest, *in persona Christi*, " stretches out his hand and gives us absolution, we will receive the same healing power that the leper in the Gospel experienced! See you in the Confessional!


