Preparing for Lent

The Holy Father has recently written his Lenten message for this year. Let us, as we prepare

to journey through the purifications of Lent to the blessings of the Cross and Easter, listen to the words of this shepherd of the Church. Here are some excerpts from his Lenten

message:

"In the poor and outcast we see Christ's face; by loving and helping the poor, we love and serve Christ. Our efforts are also directed to ending violations of human dignity, discrimination and abuse in the world, for these are so often the cause of destitution."

"Dear brothers and sisters, may this Lenten season find the whole Church ready to bear witness to all those who live in material, moral "No less a concern is *moral* destitution, which consists in slavery to vice and sin. How much pain is caused in families because one of their members – often a young person - is in thral to alcohol, drugs, gambling or pornography! How many people no longer see meaning in life or prospects for the future, how many have lost hope!"

"If we think we don't need God who reaches out to us through Christ, because we believe we can make do on our own, we are headed for a fall. God alone can truly save and free us. "

and spiritual destitution the Gospel message of the merciful love of God our Father, who is ready to embrace everyone in Christ. We can do this to the extent that we imitate Christ who became poor and enriched us by his poverty. Lent is a fitting time for self-denial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up in order to help and enrich others by our own poverty. Let us not forget that real poverty hurts: no self-denial is real without this dimension of penance. I distrust a charity that costs nothing and does not hurt."


Changing Sides



Message from the Pastor

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Friday, February 14th, the Universal Church celebrated the Feast of the Brothers, Saints Cyril and Methodius. This Sunday, we at Saint John Nepomucene Parish, built by immigrant families from Czechoslovakia, celebrate their memory with a special Mass, Procession and, of course, a meal.



These two awesome Greek Brothers were brought to the attention of the contemporary Church by Blessed Pope John Paul II in 1985 when he wrote the encyclical "Slavorum Apostoli." This encyclical, "The Apostles of the Slavs," once again renewed a devotion and knowledge of these two Saints. Blessed John Paul II wrote, "... a particular obligation to do so is felt by the first Pope called to the See of Peter from Poland, and thus from the midst of the Slav nations."



Blessed John Paul II wrote this work eleven centuries after the Brothers arrived in Greater Moravia. Since we can forget a lot in 1100 years, it is good to refresh our devotion and memory of their lives and work.

Methodius was the older brother, born between 815 and 820. Cyril was born in 827 or 828. Their father was an official in the imperial government. Both young men started out on a political career like their father. However, in 840 Methodius joined a monastery on Mount Olympus. Cyril was ordained a priest in Byzantium then joined a monastery on the Black Sea coast. They were both called out of the monastery and on a journey discovered the relics of Pope Clement and took them to Rome, presenting them to Pope Hadrian II.

When Prince Rastislav of Greater Moravia asked the Emperor Michael III to send missionaries to his land, Cyril and Methodius were chosen, sent and arrived in 863. They spent the remainder of their lives teaching the Slav people the Catholic Faith. They endured years of suffering, privation, hostility, persecution and even imprisonment. While they were visiting Rome, Cyril became ill and died in Rome in 869 on February 14th, where his body is venerated in the Basilica of Saint Clement. Methodius returned to Moravia and continued to work among the people until his death at Velehrad in 885 where his relics are venerated.
