+ Pastor's Notes

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Our first reading of this Sunday's Liturgy proclaims a truth everyone should be jumping up and down about, celebrating with all their might! Our God, the Almighty Father, Creator of all things, says through the Prophet Isaiah: "... your sins I remember no more."

What incredible news! The Good News! The Gospel of Jesus Christ! But the real question is, do we truly understand and appreciate to the fullest, what those words mean to each of us personally? We can each test ourselves on the answer to the question through the happenings in today's Gospel reading.

A paralyzed man's friends bring him with great difficulty to Jesus. They bring him because they believe that Jesus can cure him. Maybe they were around and had seen Jesus cure others. Or maybe they saw Jesus bring someone back to life from death. In fact, a lot of people were bringing themselves and others to Jesus to be cured of physical problems and diseases. The Gospel writer tells us that most folks were unable to get near Jesus because of the great crowd of people.

"When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, "Child, your sins are forgiven." After being accused of blasphemy, He also cured the man's paralysis, saying, "I say to you, rise, pick up your mat, and go home." As Jesus explains to the doubting crowd, the second miracle of curing the man's paralysis is performed to prove that the first miracle, the forgiveness of sins, actually happened. Eyes of faith are required to "see" the first miracle, while only normal sight is needed to see the second! To me, the real question would be: if you or I had a paralyzed body, but were also guilty of committing serious sins, such as adultery or stealing, would we choose to have the sin forgiven or to be able to walk and move again?

Note: Two of the Scrutinies may be moved to the Saturday, 5 PM, Mass and the Sunday, 7 AM, Mass to allow more of our parishioners to be present at these rites.

ASH WEDNESDAY

On Ash Wednesday, the blessed ashes are distributed. The ashes are made from burnt blessed palms. After the priest blesses the ashes and sprinkles them with holy water, the faithful come forward to receive them. The priest or deacon dips his right thumb in the ashes and, making the Sign of the Cross on each person's forehead, says, "Remember, man, that thou art dust, and to dust thou shalt return" (or a variation on those words). The distribution of ashes reminds us of our own mortality and calls us to repentance.

LAWS OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has determined that the following practice shall prevail in the United States:

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all those who have celebrated their 18th birthday and have not yet celebrated their 60th birthday. (you must also consider the health of the individual and any special dietary needs) Fasting means to eat only one complete meal and two much smaller ones during the day, with no food in between.


Abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent by all who have celebrated their 14th birthday.

EASTER DUTY

Catholics are obligated to receive the Eucharist at least once a year between Easter Sunday and Trinity Sunday. (cf.Canon 920) However, you are encouraged to receive at every Mass you attend.

RECONCILIATION DUTY

Catholics guilty of a grave sin are obliged to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance) at least once a year. (cf.Canon 989) Of course, you are encouraged to receive Reconciliation much more often even if you don't have a grave sin, simply to receive the graces of Confession.
