Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

In our Gospel reading from St. Matthew we hear Jesus saying to us, "Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

What a challenge! What a confrontation from Our Lord to each one of us personally! We are to guit behaving like pagans and become like Him. But how is that possible? We are only human. We are not divine like He is.

At the Offertory of the Mass, as the priest places a drop of water in the chalice of wine, he prays, "By the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the divinity of Christ, who humbled Himself to share in our humanity."

These words are the revelation of our power to overcome sin and become like Christ. By sharing in Christ's divinity, through our Baptism and sharing in the Eucharist, we then have the power to defeat temptation and grow in holiness. Our Heavenly Father is perfect holiness, but we can become more like Him through the Body and Blood of His Son, Jesus Christ.

It is by consuming the true drink and true food of His Body and Blood that we grow in strength. Like the cliché, "You are what you eat!" In this case, the Lord Jesus assures us of that in St. John's Gospel.

This is why we as Roman Catholics have always encouraged both frequent Confession and Daily Mass. The cleansing power of Confession makes us capable of absorbing all the grace of the Eucharist received at Daily Mass. This then helps us to grow in the virtues which enable us to live holy lives. This is what makes Saints! We are all called to be Saints by the very words of Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel reading.

See you in Confession—see you at Mass!


