int John and Epiphany Parishioners,

In our reading from the Saint Matthew's Gospel we hear Jesus saying these words to each one of us personally, "Rise, and do not be afraid."

Many times during Lent when each of us, aided by the Holy Spirit, takes a good, honest look at our lives we are tempted to want to fall down under the weight of our sins and not get up. If we truly make a good examination of conscience before going to the Sacrament of Confession we often feel like we cannot change those sins in our lives. Or maybe we think that we cannot change the circumstances in our lives that often lead us to sin. Or perhaps, we think that the mistakes and bad choices we have already made in our lives make it impossible to change certain sinful conditions.

Several days before the Gospel Reading today, Jesus had told Peter, James and John in Caesarea Philippi, that He was to undergo suffering in Jerusalem, that He was going to die at the hands of the chief priests, the elders and the Scribes. How disappointed, confused, dismayed, angry and sad the disciples must have been. They were probably thinking they had given up their regular lives, left their families, made enemies, and perhaps lost their businesses in order to follow this man who now announces to them He is going to be killed. How crazy and terrible that must have been for Peter, James and John. They must have felt like giving up and running away from Jesus.

Our God always comes to the rescue! He took them off by themselves and revealed His glory and power to give them the confidence and faith they needed. The Gospel says that Jesus "came and touched them, saying, Rise, and do not be afraid."

We need to take this account as an example of how we are to handle the times we also feel lost, afraid, defeated, angry or confused with our sinful lives. We need to go away, into a quiet place and allow Jesus to touch us and speak to us. This is what these 40 days of Lent are all about. We need to place ourselves in a special situation with Jesus. We do this through our fasting, almsgiving, and prayer. Our Lenten Spiritual Reading and Prayer Time, the Stations of the Cross and Benediction, but most especially, the prayer of the Sacrament of Confession and the Eucharist.

He will touch us and speak to us!
