

## THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER

The Great Vigil of Easter is the "night of nights," the liturgy for Holy Saturday declares. It is the night during which the Church keeps vigil for the resurrection of Jesus. It is during the Easter Vigil that the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation are celebrated and new members are welcomed into the Church. This "most blessed of all nights," as the *Exsultet* on Holy Saturday proclaims, celebrates in ancient rituals the central mysteries of the faith. This celebration is longer, but it is the heart of the Church's worship and speaks clearly to fill participants with the joy of the Resurrection.

### WHAT IS THE SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION?

"Reconciliation" is one of the seven Holy Sacraments. It is the Sacrament that has the divine power to forgive our sins and renew our love for God and people.

## Reconciliation has 4 parts. They are:

**Contrition**—we feel great sorrow for our sins

**Confession**—we unburden our sins

**Absolution**—we are assured of God's forgiveness

Satisfaction—we perform an act of penance

The Sacrament is also called "confession" or "penance". The aim of Penance is genuine healing of sins' effects through a personal meeting in faith with the forgiving Christ. The Sacrament lifts the burden of sin, renews the grace of Baptism, and gives an inner peace and a new strength of purpose. See schedule on Holy Week page.


