Pastor's Message

Wednesday within the Octave of Easter +2014

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"This is the day the Lord has made; let us be glad and rejoice in it!"


We are in the Octave of Easter! Stretching out this amazing gift from our God! Easter Sunday, Resurrection Day, is celebrated for eight days! This eight day period, the Octave, helps us to open up to the Risen Christ and take His Spirit into ourselves, our life and the lives of those around us.

The Masses and Readings of this Octave all give us different angles on the same Truth. Jesus Christ has risen from the dead and desires to bring each of us out of our old lives of sin into the newness of Life in Him.

In his talk this morning at the Wednesday Audience in St. Peter's Square, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, elaborated on these Scriptures read these first days of the Octave. Pope Francis quotes the angel at the tomb speaking to the women: "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" (Lk 24:5)

The Holy Father goes on to point out that most of the encounters with Christ involved folks who were still looking "among the dead." We ourselves continue to look for life among the dead things of this world. We look for life in money, in success and worldly vanities. Or like the fellows on the way to Emmaus, we continue to live in the past, rather than moving on to Life in the Risen Christ. The Holy Father says the question of the angel at the tomb, "...helps us to resist the temptation to look back, to what was yesterday and pushes us forward into the future. Jesus is not in the tomb, He is the Risen Lord, the Living, the One who always renews His body which is the Church and helps her walk, pulling her towards Him."

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.


(Repeat step 2 and 3 for all five decades).


