Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

From our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

"It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God."

From our Second Reading from the Book of Revelation:

"...there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain..."

From our Gospel Reading:

"As I have loved you, so you also should love one another."

After a first reading of these three scripture passages, it doesn't seem like they really go together. The forecast of many hardships, then the declaration of no more wailing or pain, then the admonition to love as He loves us, doesn't seem to gel. Like, are you going to give us suffering and hardships or are you going to take them away? And what does this have to do with love?

Brothers and sisters, this is the paradox of our Catholic Faith. It is the paradox of the Cross. It is the Paschal Mystery we are baptized into. That through suffering and death comes new life! It doesn't make sense to our world. It doesn't even make sense to us good Catholics much of the time.

We must not only intellectually understand this "mystery" but we must continually practice it in everyday life so that it becomes "who we are." We must ask the Holy Spirit to give us the grace to make this "Truth" real in our lives.

A good way to practically understand how this works is by reading the lives of the Saints. This is the way a person lives to become a Saint. This is what a Saint understands as being necessary to make it to Heaven. This is also the key to a peaceful and joy-filled life here on earth.
