Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem...."

These words from today's Gospel tell us of the excitement and zeal in the early Church! Adult Confirmations

Are you an adult who is a Baptized Catholic but who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation?

Do you want to receive this Sacrament, be sealed with the Holy Spirit, and work to build up the Church?

Adults will be confirmed at St. John Nepomucene on Pentecost Sunday, June 12.

To receive Confirmation on this date you must:

- Already be a Baptized Catholic
- Fill out the application for Confirmation available online or in the parish office (there is a \$25 processing fee with this application).
- Turn this application in to the Parish Office before **May 31**.
- Attend the Confirmation Preparation class on May 31.
- Submit a recently issued (within the past 6 months) Baptismal certificate with notations.

Sponsors for Confirmation:

- Must be fully initiated Catholics (must have received Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation)
- If married, must be married in the Catholic Church.
- May not be living conjugally with someone outside of marriage.
- Must attend the Confirmation Preparation class on **May 31.**
- Must submit a recently issued (within the past 6 months) Baptismal certificate with notations.

If you do not turn in the application and certificates, and all other requirements are not met by May 31, you will have to go through RCIA or wait until next year for Confirmation.


