Pastor's Message

Wednesday of the Fifth Week of Easter +2014

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"Holy Spirit, please come and dwell in me!" As we are approaching the amazing Feast of Pentecost, we continue to hear Jesus call us to desire and ask for the Holy Spirit in our lives. Our readings this morning, Wednesday, May 21st, have Jesus teaching that we are the branches and He is the vine. Even in our less agrarian and more industrialized culture, we recognize that if we cut a branch from a tree or bush, it will die. The branch must remain attached to receive the nutrients and water necessary for life.

Jesus assures us in this Sunday's readings that He and the Father will send us the Holy Spirit as soon as He arrives back in Heaven. This Spirit is the power and life nutrients that build and sustain our spiritual life in Christ here on earth. We must stay connected to Jesus the vine in order for this Holy Spirit to dwell in us.

Our readings from the Acts of the Apostles during this Easter Season show us the everyday life of the early Church. In these readings we see the hardships and struggles the first Catholics had to endure to live and proclaim this Jesus and our Catholic Faith. We can understand as we read these chapters about the life of the first Christians how much they had to depend on the power of the Holy Spirit.

I would encourage us all to read and re-read these first chapters in the Acts of the Apostles during these last couple weeks of Easter Season before the Feast of Pentecost.
