Letter from the Pastor

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Corpus Christi - +2013

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

He LOVES us! How much does He love us? So much that He never leaves us. He dwells within us by our Baptism and is always available on the Prayer Line....but all that wasn't enough! Not for our God and Redeemer!

He physically, really, stayed here with us....Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity! The whole Jesus really present on our Altars at every Mass, then hangs around with us in our Tabernacles. We can always pop into a Catholic Church and visit with Him right there in the Tabernacle.

Many of our Churches have special times of Eucharistic Adoration. During these times we bring Jesus out of the Tabernacle and place Him in a beautiful Gold Vessel called a Monstrance where we can physically see Him with our own eyes. This is a special and intimate, physical closeness to our Lord and Savior in the Blessed Sacrament.

Over the centuries, Catholics became increasingly reverent and devoted to this real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. They found new ways to show their devotion and adoration of Him. St. Francis of Assisi wrote often of the amazing gift we all have in His Eucharistic presence, on our altars and in our tabernacles.

In the year 1264, Pope Urban IV, declared a special Feast for this devotion; Corpus Christi. He commissioned Saint Thomas Aquinas to compose special hymns and prayers for the Mass and Adoration. These are the same prayers and hymns we sing today whenever His Eucharistic Presence is adored and praised.

Thursday evening, we here at St. John Nepomucene continued this Catholic tradition in adoration and praise of Jesus in our Procession. Now, this weekend, we honor this gift during our Masses here at St. John Nepomucene. Let each of us, as He becomes present on our Altar, offer Him all of our praise and adoration, just as He offered Himself completely for us.







"Each and every one of us," the Pope said, "needs to examine our conscience and find out what riches keep us from approaching Jesus on the road of life." They are the riches that come from our culture. The first is "well-being" or comfort or luxury, he said. "The culture of well-being that gives us little courage, makes us lazy and selfish."
