Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity + 2011

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Once again, I am writing this message away from our Parish. It seems that once the school year has ended, the conference year begins! Last week I was writing from the Priest's Convocation with our Bishop in Westlake.

This week I am writing from the sunny and hot desert of Phoenix, Arizona.

This is sort of a déjà vu, experience for me. I began my priestly ministry at St. John Nepomucene Parish following my ordination on May 18th, 1996. Before I had even reported to work at the parish, the Pastor, Fr. Fred Sidler asked me to attend the Life Teen Training Conference here in Phoenix. This was to be my first formal encounter with the world of Youth Ministry. Fr. Fred wanted to begin the High School Youth Ministry Program, Life Teen, at St. John Nepomucene Parish.

Now, here I am, some fifteen years later, my second assignment at St. John Nepomucene Parish, dressed in all black, baking in the 106 degree weather in Arizona! What person, who daily dresses in all black, with long pants and jacket, would come to Phoenix in the summer-time! And an even better question, concerning his state of sanity, is "Why?"

Ah! But our God is always good and provides! Especially to His unworthy Pastors!

From the mouth of God, this Sunday's Gospel:

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life."

This is the "Why!" This is the reason there are over 500 adults/young adults and 75 priests from parishes all over the United States baking in this summer Phoenix heat. They are here to learn how to better implement the Life Teen and Edge Programs in their parishes, to bring Jesus and His Truth to our young people, our children.

This is the Good News from our God; Father, Son and

Holy Spirit, that must be made known and understood to every young person in our parishes. God loves each of them personally and has a good plan for their life. It is the plan which is the only one that will bring good in their lives.

Through the Life Teen High School Program and The Edge Middle School Program this Truth is proclaimed to our young people in a way they can encounter and understand the Living God! Through the Eucharist, the Real Presence of Jesus at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, our young people meet the One who loves them perfectly! Through the Life Nights, Retreats, D-Nights and special events, our youth grow to understand His will in their lives. They are helped to make their Catholic Faith practical in their daily lives as Middle School or High School Youth. They need this help to understand how their Catholic Faith applies to each and every day they live at home, school, work or play. They need to understand how their Catholic Faith is to determine the thoughts they think, the words they say and the actions they do.

I am very proud of our Parish, all of you who make this ministry possible. God loves all of us. He invites all His children to come to Him. We, as adults, have the responsibility to see that it is possible for our children to get to Him. We must clear their path to Him. We must run defense for them against the Devil who would block their way to Jesus and the good life He wants them to live!

Please keep all who work in Youth Ministry in your prayers. In a special way keep our Youth Minister, Joey Scancellia, and our Life Teen Core in your prayers.
