Pastor's Message

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul +2014

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"Peter said in reply, You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. Jesus said to him in reply, Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father."

These words of Christ to Peter are the foundation of our personal, living Faith. Each of us must be given and accept the Gift of Faith from the Father, through His Son, Jesus, in the power of the Holy Spirit. This gift and acceptance of it, gives us a confirmed Faith upon which we can live out our lives.

FRIDAY, JULY 4- Independence Day —OFFICE CLOSED When we truly "know" something, which implies "believing" in something, then we will almost automatically act upon that knowledge. It becomes who we are and determines our lives. This is why the Apostles and early Disciples of Jesus. continually asked Him to help their unbelief and increase their Faith.

> Our theology, inspired by Scripture, teaches us that Faith is a free gift from God. We cannot "make" ourselves believe. We can, should and have an obligation to learn about our Faith, however, just knowing it in our heads, does not make it who we are. We can believe in our minds about our Catholic Faith, and try to live out what we believe mentally, but without the Gift of Faith from God, which drills what we "know intellectually" into our hearts, the world/devil will be able to lure/trick us away from a life of Faith.

Holy Scripture and our Tradition tells us that we need to continually ask the Father to both bestow and increase this Gift of Faith. "Make me stronger in my Faith, Lord! Send your Holy Spirit into me!"







Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. he asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh; he asked for acts of reparation, for frequent Communion, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, she did not base her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

First Fridays

From the writings of St. Margaret Mary:

"On Friday during Holy Communion, He said these words to His unworthy slave, if I mistake not: I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that its all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on nine first Fridays of consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they will not die under my displeasure or without receiving their sacraments, my divine Heart making itself their assured refuge at the last moment."

With regard to this promise it may be remarked: (1) that our Lord required Communion to be received on a particular day chosen by Him; (2) that the nine Fridays must be consecutive; (3) that they must be made in honor of His Sacred Heart, which means that those who make the nine Fridays must practice the devotion and must have a great love for our Lord; (4) that our Lord does not say that those who make the nine Fridays will be dispensed from any of their obligations or from exercising the vigilance necessary to lead a good life and overcome temptation; rather He implicitly promises abundant graces to those who make the nine Fridays to help them to carry out these obligations and persevere to the end; (5) that perseverance in receiving Holy Communion for nine consecutive First Fridays helps the faithful to acquire the habit of frequent Communion, which our Lord eagerly desires; and (6) that the practice of the nine Fridays is very pleasing to our Lord since He promises such great reward, and that all Catholics should endeavor to make the nine Fridays.

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life
- 2. I will establish peace in their families.
- 3. I will comfort them in all their difficulties.
- 4. I will be their refuge during life and especially at the hour of death.
- 5. I will shed abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in My Heart a fountain and boundless ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.
- 9. I will give to priests the power of touching the hardest hearts.

- 10. I will bless those places where the image of my Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.
- 11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart never to be blotted out.
- 12. I promise thee, in the excessive mercy of My Heart, that My all-powerful love will grant to all who communicate on the first Friday of the month for nine consecutive months, the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My displeasure nor without their sacraments: My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.
