# Letter from the Pastor

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time +2013

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

The Kingdom of God is not behind us, but rather in front of us. We must always be moving toward the Kingdom and Our Lord Jesus Christ. If we stop moving forward and look backward, we are prone to regrets, desires for ease and comfort, selfishness and losing our way. Jesus says in today's Gospel: "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

This last weekend Nepomucene's Teens traveled to Alexandria, Louisiana for the Steubenville South High School Youth Conference. Our teens joined 3,000 other Catholic teenagers to meet the Lord Jesus and hear Him say to each one of them personally, "Follow me." From Friday evening until Sunday night Jesus dined with us, taught us, listened to us praise Him, forgave us in Confession, fed us with His Body and Blood, partied with us and touched us.

Now we must each answer Him. Will we answer Him by looking back longingly to the sinful things we did before Jesus taught us? Will we answer Him by looking back to being with old friends who led us away from Jesus? Will we answer Him by listening to music and watching movies that insult Him and His teaching? Will we answer Him by not returning to Confession and saying, "I'm sorry, Jesus"? Will we answer Him by not visiting with Him in prayer? Will we answer Him by not showing up when He comes to be with us at Mass?

As Pastor of these youth who traveled to Louisiana to meet Jesus, I am very proud. They all responded to His invitation to come to meet and know Him. They came, they attended, they participated and they opened their hearts. I pray for each of them that they will answer His call by continuing to follow Him, and not look back.


Feast of Saint Thomas, apostle, July 3rd





# What did Vatican II say about the Liturgy of the Hours?

**84.** By tradition going back to early Christian times, the divine office is devised so that the whole course of the day and night is made holy by the praises of God. Therefore, when this wonderful song of praise is rightly performed by priests and others who are deputed for this purpose by the Church's ordinance, or



of the bride addressed to her bridegroom; It is the very prayer which Christ Himself, together with His body, addresses to the Father.

85. Hence all who render this service are not only fulfilling a duty of the Church, but also are sharing in the greatest honor of Christ's spouse, for by offering these praises to God they are standing before

God's throne in the name of the Church

their Mother.

**100.** And the laity, too, are encouraged to recite the divine office, either with the priests, or among themselves, or even individually.
