Letter from the Pastor

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time + 2013

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

I am writing this bulletin message on Monday afternoon. Tomorrow morning I am leaving to fly to Omaha, Nebraska then drive to Nebraska City, Nebraska. My sister, Anna Marie and family, live in the Omaha/Nebraska City area. I am flying to Nebraska to baptize my newest great-niece and the second child of my Godson, Ed O'Bryan and his wife, Alesia.

I planned this trip, sort of last minute. But my reason is good, I believe. Nebraska City is much closer and an easier trip to schedule than Saudi Arabia! In case you don't remember, I travelled to Minsk, Belarus to baptize their first child on July 27th, 2010! Nebraska is definitely closer than either Belarus or Saudi Arabia. So I am catching them while they are home!

It is not the case that my Godson is an international criminal hiding from the U. S. authorities. Rather, he is the Political/Economic Officer for the U. S. State Department at the Consulate General in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia. I am very proud of him.

Thinking of a new baby, our country, our world and the future, brings many ideas to mind, some of them quite exciting and some very sobering and worrisome. Our Holy Father just completed a very important journey to the Italian Island of Lampedusa. This island might be called the "Ellis Island" of Europe. Many immigrants escaping terrible lives find their way by boat to this tiny island. Many suffer tragedy and death as a result.

In his homily Pope Francis questions the existence of the love, we as Christians, are commanded by Jesus to have for our neighbor in this Sunday's Gospel. The Holy Father characterizes the world my great niece, Anna, has been born into as one of "Global Indifference." He says the globalization of indifference has even taken from us the ability to weep for others! The culture of well-being that makes us think of ourselves, makes us insensitive to the cries of others.

The Holy Father prayed: "...we ask forgiveness for the indifference towards so many brothers and sisters, we ask forgiveness for those who are pleased with themselves, who are closed in on their own well-being in a way that leads to the anesthesia of the heart, we ask you, Father, for forgiveness for those who with their decisions at the global level have created situations that lead to these tragedies. Forgive us, Lord!"


