Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Saint Paul is speaking to every Baptized Christian in Ephesus and in Ennis, Texas! Our second reading announced that, "He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him." (Eph1:3-14)

Through Baptism and Confirmation all Catholics belong to, "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people." (1Pet2:9) Every Catholic can now in a real way, "offer it up!" This became a cliché in our Catholic Culture, however, like many clichés, it was based in truth. The problem lies in the "emptying of meaning" of clichés. Because of their becoming part of ordinary language, they often lose the truth of their meaning and are looked upon as fiction.

If the Devil, through culture, can downplay the sacrificial, priestly meaning of every Catholic life, he can make our lives more secular. Secular can be defined as worldly, temporal or the state of being separate from religion. The whole point of Baptism, is to raise us up to a supernatural life in Christ, above this earthly, worldly life. Our priesthood of the Baptized, gives us the opportunity to take our works, trials and sufferings, and offer them up to God, as spiritual sacrifices which sanctify the world. These offerings bring the grace won by Jesus Christ on the Cross into our world for sanctification. The Second Vatican Council states this in *Lumen Gentium, 10*.

Jesus, ascended into Heaven, leaving Evil in this world. Evil enters the life of every person, through disease, betrayal, anger, injustice, etc. Some evil we bring into our own lives through our choice to sin and cooperate with Evil. However, evil enters the life of the innocent, such as abortion. Jesus, the perfectly innocent one, still suffered the evil of this world.

God gave us the gift of being able to turn our suffering into a useful good. For the Christian there is no such thing as useless suffering. If we "offer it up" with the sufferings of Christ, sanctifying grace will flow into our broken world and accomplish good. This is how we are each able every day to change the world for the good. A factory worker as he does his job, the mother/housewife as she cleans and cooks, the banker as he makes a loan, the teacher as she works with her students, can each effect the whole world for good as they perform their particular tasks each day.

What an amazing deal! So, "offer it up!"

<u>Answer</u>: **Yes**, the Saturday vigil Mass fulfills the Sunday obligation. "The obligation of assisting at Mass is satisfied wherever Mass is celebrated in a Catholic rite either on a holy day itself *or on the evening of the previous day* (canon 1248 1, Code of Canon Law(1983) emphasis added)
