Letter from the Pastor

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time + 2013

Dear Epiphany and Saint John Parishioners,

As the Gospel is proclaimed this Sunday, we hear the familiar line spoken by Our Lord to Martha: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

The question we need to ask is: "What would Martha have wanted Jesus to have taken from Mary?" The answer is that Martha wanted Jesus to tell Mary to quit spending time with Him and instead, to leave Jesus and go help her in the kitchen. This is what I get from the conversation, anyway.

Many times when folks hear or read this Gospel passage they interpret it as meaning that Jesus is laying out two different choices for a way of life. The choice is either a contemplative or an active apostolic way of life. However, if we prayerfully read this passage we understand that Jesus is actually promoting one way of life for everyone, all of humanity.

The only thing Jesus tells either of them to do is directed to Martha. He is telling her to quit worrying and being anxious. He does not tell her to quit working in the kitchen....or they would all go hungry! The food has to be prepared! He also does not tell Mary to quit spending time with Him. He only says that Mary is doing the most important thing, implying that Martha isn't spending time with Him.

The only logical answer out of this situation is that Martha while doing her work in the kitchen needs to also spend time with Jesus. If I am visiting a parishioner's home for supper, I have to choose whether to be with the folks waiting and visiting in the living room (or watching football!) or in the kitchen visiting with those preparing the meal. But Jesus can and wants to be with everyone....everywhere! Your Pastor cannot yet, bilocate! Lucky you!!! But Jesus can!

Martha needs to holler: "Hey Jesus, come into the kitchen and visit with me, too?" We need to always bring Jesus into our thoughts and actions. Mentally keeping Him present will truly make Him present in all we do. Then the worry and anxiety go away!

SANCTUARY ALTAR CANDLES THIS WEEK




New RCIA Inquiry Period starting
