Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

I am writing this message on Wednesday afternoon following the Funeral Mass for Kenneth Langley. Monday morning I celebrated the Funeral Mass for Johnnie Mensik. Tomorrow morning, Thursday, I will celebrate at 10:00 am the Funeral Mass for Nolen Dockery. During these Masses of Christian Burial I have been thinking also of this upcoming Sunday's Gospel Reading.

Through the last fifteen years of my priesthood I have found that, at least for me personally, the celebration of Funeral Masses puts our Catholic Faith in clearer focus. After all, this is what it is all about, the end of the line, the finish of the race, as St. Paul says in his letters. As St. Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians 5:10; "for we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive good or evil, according to what he has done in the body."

Now, with this in mind, the words of Jesus from this Sunday's Gospel ring clear and true. "The Kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure buried in a field, which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field "

This also echoes the familiar question and answer from my childhood and the Baltimore Catechism. Why did God create us? He created us to know, love and serve Him in this world and be with Him forever in Heaven.

Our mortal life in this world then becomes a segment from an Indian Jones movie plot; the long, arduous and often dangerous hunt for the "treasure" that will last into eternity and is of immeasurable value. However, unlike the exciting and fast moving plot of a movie, our faith life is often one of endurance and perseverance throughout a lifetime.

The "Hunt" is worth it! This is also evident from the faithful, Catholic lives well lived and the deaths, though painful and slow, that can be said were peaceful, full of hope and joyful!

Keep the Faith, fight the fight, run the race! St. Joseph, pray for us to have a happy death!


Our Youth Minister Joey Scancella and Nikki Traylor exchanged
