Then off to his tomb in the St. Vitus Cathedral to beg for his intercession for our wonderful parish! I cannot wait to see where we pray Evening Prayer and have our next delicious meal!!!

MOVIE ON POPE JOHN PAUL II

After the wedding shower mentioned above for Seth & Annette, there will be a special showing on the "Nine Days That Changed the World", on Pope John Paul II's historic nineday pilgrimage to Poland in 1979 and how it created a revolution of conscience that transformed Poland and fundamentally reshaped the spiritual and political landscape of the 20th Century. Within 16 months, Solidarity became the first officially recognized free trade union in the Communist bloc, with over 10 million members. The momentum of this nineday visit would eventually lead to the fall of the Berlin Wall in November 1989 and the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991. Plan to stay and watch the film!

Please help with the Bazaar in any way you can. Your support and generosity will make our Bazaar successful.




