Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

It is still hot! Our crops and fields are still very dry! We have been praying for rain! Has God gone deaf? After all, He is getting pretty old!

We as humans often ask questions with this theme. We especially ask them after hearing a verse from Scripture such as our Responsorial Psalm today. Our response this weekend is: "The hand of the Lord feeds us: He answers all our needs."

OK! So where is the rain? Where is the job that my family and I so desperately need? Where is the relief from this pain that I feel? Where is the peace for my marriage and family? Why can't I quit drinking, gambling or viewing pornography? Why won't my husband or wife change? God should know I need and desire all these things.

Also, according to Scripture, God's ultimate goal for us is to spend eternity in Heaven with Him. To get there we need to come to know Him, fall in love with Him, trust Him and therefore serve Him with everything we think, do or say.

Even when this is also our ultimate goal, we often differ with God's choices on the day to day living out of our lives. God is like the perfect, personal trainer or coach. He knows exactly what each one of us needs to develop the skills to attain our final goal. For an athlete this is the skill and strength necessary to win in the final game.

Many times, the individual athlete does not understand the exercises or practice the coach asks of him or the team during the time before the final game. It may not be understood why he has even allowed them to make some of the bad moves or plays that lost them some points. However, a good coach has a plan for each player to be the best he can be. He often allows him to learn from his mistakes. He requires him to practice a particular skill, over and over again until it seems pointless to the athlete.

Our God has a plan for each one of us and the whole of humanity. If we stay in a state of grace so that we can hear Him and prayerfully listen, He will guide us to our ultimate victory. This doesn't mean that we won't make mistakes, sweat, suffer and be disappointed along the way.

Like a winning coach, we look at all the past teams and athletes he has coached to victory. How many of his athletes have won the gold medal! For God, this is the great company of Saints! These are the folks who have gone before us and won the prize! We read and study the lives and spirituality of those who have won the gold!

Items especially needed:


- New or gently loved stuffed animals
