Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

I am writing this on Wednesday morning, August 22<sup>nd</sup>. This is the Octave Day of the Solemnity of the Assumption that we celebrated last week. The word Octave means eight. So, this is the Octave Day of the Assumption, which is the Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary!

Each year, as Roman Catholics we celebrate the Queenship of Mary on August 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Octave of the Feast of the Assumption. What does it mean to celebrate her Queenship?

The first meaning, of course, is that if she is Queen Mother then her Son must be the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords! The Second Vatican Council proclaimed in *Lumen Gentium*, *59*:

"The Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all guilt of original sin, on the completion of her earthly sojourn, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen of the universe, that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the "Lord of Lords" (Rev 19:16), and the conqueror of sin and death."

As Queen, Mary reigns in heaven with her Son, Jesus Christ, King and God. Mary is Queen as dispenser of the treasures and goods of the Kingdom of God. We come to her as children who ask for her intercession with her Son, Jesus. She presents our prayers before God, and thereby increases their value. In the name of her Son she applies His merits and her own to souls

The rule of Mary is daily exercised over all the earth. She diligently watches over all her children whom Jesus gave to her from His Cross. Each day we seek her patronage and ask for her protection over ourselves and those we love

What a wonderful Feast this day is, as we crown her Queen of Heaven and Earth!!!!




