Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"You duped me, O Lord, and I let myself be duped!" These words fly out of the mouth of Jeremiah the Prophet in our first reading this weekend. As Catholics, if we endeavor to live our faith seriously, we will undoubtedly have times when we echo these words of the Prophet Jeremiah. We might even catch ourselves thinking, "I don't want to be Catholic, it is too hard and crazy." Yet, like our Psalmist, we realize, "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God."

Love causes us to do crazy things. Jesus says in our Gospel this weekend that we should not think as human beings do, we should take up a cross and we should lose our life in this world. Since all of these things sound really crazy, this love for Jesus must be a crazy, powerful love, too. It must be a love that surpasses everything else in our lives. It must be a love that is our only goal and desire.


