Pastor's Message

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross +2014

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Last week I wrote about the Holy Father's daily Mass homily on "Christian Identity." The Holy Father emphasized that it is having the Spirit of God, the anointing of the Holy Spirit that gives us our Christian Identity. It is the power, the life of the Holy Spirit that animates us and causes us to be identified as Christian, followers of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, if the Holy Spirit dwells in us and directs our thoughts, words and actions to be like those of Jesus, people can then watch us and say, "He/She acts just like Jesus!" It is also very helpful to us as an examination of conscience to determine if that presence of the Holy Spirit is strong in us or if as a result of sin, has grown weak inside of us. When we examine our conscience and discover that many of our thoughts, words and actions do not match up with Jesus, it is time for a good Confession, then a strengthening of our spiritual life by daily Mass, Prayer and Adoration.

This morning, Wednesday, September 10th, the Holy Father at his Wednesday Audience in St. Peter's Square with 50,000 people taught us:

"And so the Church acts like Jesus. She does not give lectures on love, on mercy. She does not spread a philosophy, a path of wisdom throughout the world... Of course, Christianity is all of this, but as a consequence, in reflection. The Mother Church, like Jesus, teaches by example. . .teaches us to give food and drink to the hungry and thirsty, to clothe the naked. With the example of many \$18,676.47 saints who have done this in an exemplary manner."

\$955.26 Repeating the words of the Holy Father, last week: "We all \$354.67 need to ask for this. Lord, grant us Christian Identity, which You had. Grant us Your Spirit. Grant us Your way of thinking, feeling, speaking: May the Lord grant us the anointing of the Holy Spirit."

Come, again, Holy Spirit!

The fiscal year for St. John's has come to a close as of June 30, 2014 and because of that, we would like to thank all those who made it financially possible. It is through your regular Sunday collections and generous donations that we are able to continue to build our Church both physically and spiritually within the local community.

Thanks to your contributions in the last year we have been able to accomplish many great things in our parish family, including:

- The school rooms & Assumption Hall renovation to prepare for leasing to the new Pre-Kindergarten Nepomucene's Children net cost \$33,557.
- Start-up costs, for salaries and operating expenses, of \$60,000 were transferred to Nepomucene's Children.
- The Adoration chapel was prepared and opened, including new outdoor lights and sidewalk for \$8,636.
- The Holy Spirit mural & painting installed in the church sanctuary for \$38,400.
- Christmas and Lenten missions were held with visiting CFR priests for \$7,511.

Our annual financials have undergone the annual Agreed Upon Procedures review by an independent accounting firm, Yeldell, Wilson and Co. and found to be in complete compliance with Diocesan policy on September 9, 2014. 
