Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"Woe to the complacent in Zion!" We hear these words from Our Lord through the Prophet Amos in our first reading this Sunday. Complacency, becoming self-satisfied and selfishly content is a great danger to our Catholic spiritual life. It is one of the Devil's most deadly and seemingly harmless tactics. He, the Devil, is very good at his job! He has been practicing for thousands of years! Complacency keeps us from "getting out there" and "doing it!" It keeps us sitting on our behinds at home rather than going out and being the Missionaries we are Baptized to be. Jesus' words to us are most often verbs, words of action!

Our second reading from St. Paul urges us to "pursue" or "go after" righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience and gentleness. We always need to be "in pursuit" or "running after" the life of holiness. It is a constant effort which is why St. Paul often uses the comparison of an athlete or soldier. We can't just sit and "stay in shape." We must continually work out and push ourselves further.

St. Paul says that we must "lay hold of eternal life." Again a work of action, to reach out and grab it! Heaven and blessings here on earth are the prizes we must run after and race for. St. Paul encourages us to stay in the race and persevere to the end! But the Devil tempts us to sit and enjoy! He knows that if we just sit we will actually be falling backwards into Hell! This is the message of the Gospel this weekend.

The rich man dressed up each day and sat and ate. He was sinfully complacent in his life. He was not working each day for the holiness that requires us to love and serve our God and neighbor as ourselves. His neighbor laid at his door suffering, sick and hungry! His God looked down from Heaven on his complacency.

Jesus knows that it is hard for us to shake ourselves out of complacency and get up and do holiness! This is why he tells the rich man that folks won't be persuaded even "if someone should rise from the dead!"



Starts Monday, September 27


