Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time +2014

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"Amen, I say to you, tax collectors (thieves) and prostitutes are entering the Kingdom of God before you."

Who did Jesus SAY THIS to? They must have been a REALLY bad group of people.

No, Jesus made this statement to the CHIEF PRIESTS and ELDERS of the people!

These are the people who would have been respected in the community. The Jewish people respected their elders and looked to them for wisdom. These were the "Chief" priests! The ones who had risen in authority and respect because of their work in the Temple and community.

This reading ends with the Jesus saying: "... you did not later change your minds and believe him."

Our life of holiness, of being a follower/disciple of Jesus Christ, requires each of us to make the choice of believing in the Gospel every day. Our choice to believe must then show forth in our thoughts, words and actions, how we actually live each day.

We must, by our choices, strive each day toward greater holiness. We must work to imitate Christ more closely each day. We should always have "growing pains!" We can never "relax" and "coast" along just doing what we did the day before.


Training for Extraordinary Ministers
