Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Our Scripture readings this Sunday are truly AMAZING!!! The Peace of the Lord is given to us who faithfully persevere in the work of His vineyard, the Church. Saint Paul gives a very practical list of the qualities and attitude that Jesus wants his workers to have. We are to be a people that focus and strive for all that is honorable, just, pure, lovely, gracious, excellent and worthy of praise. This is to be our demeanor and goal. These are the qualifications that should govern everything about us. This list of Saint Paul's should qualify our entire lives.

Our God and who He is in all the qualities He has revealed to us, should shine through our lives. He should be reflected in our speech, actions, decisions and thoughts. He should be revealed through how we continue to share in His creative work. He should be revealed through the smallest of our daily activities to the greatest!

In order to reveal Him, obviously, we must know Him. We must know all about Him: His plans, desires, goals, commandments and wisdom. In writing about what a University should be, Fr. Terence Henry, TOR, President of Franciscan University of Steubenville, says that God has been "shut out of classrooms and campuses... and that has been a grave mistake." This is also what has happened everywhere.

He writes further, "to form minds without forming characters is to produce men and women who don't know how to think or live or love rightly. Likewise, to impart knowledge while denying truth, God, and faith, is to impart many facts but little wisdom. The world in which you and I live – (is) a world where truth, life and human dignity, marriage and family,

God and faith have all been devalued or denied."

We all suffer the results of stealing the vineyard away from the landowner, and killing His Son. Jesus tells us,

"Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

Let us choose to be that people, His people.
