Letter from the Pastor

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time + 2013

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"The Apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith." The beginning words of today's Good News proclaimed to us according to Saint Luke. The exciting part is that Jesus answers back to them that they "got it!" It is Faith, an ever stronger Faith that gives us a true life in Christ that changes us, others around us and our world. Christ must have been so excited that His Apostles are starting to have a clue! Remember, that many times they are completely misunderstanding who Jesus is and what He is trying to give them by His life and teaching.

Many times they are just fighting about who is best among them, or asking Jesus for first place, or wanting to "call down fire" to destroy anyone who doesn't agree with them! Jesus is now excited that they have figured out that all these other concerns would not be an issue if they were living lives of faith. With a living faith, all things can be accomplished! He tells them excitedly that even a tiny faith can do amazing things....just think what a strong faith can do.

When we ask Jesus to increase our faith, we are asking Him to hang out with us more, to fill us with His presence, to give us the awareness of His power and love. If we are "full of Jesus" then Jesus should spill out of us. Many times we say of ourselves or others that we are "full of _____," and that is what is coming out of us or others! So how much better to increase the amount of Jesus in us!

As we fall on our knees during the Consecration of the Mass, let us echo the words of the Apostles and ask what we really should be asking Him for; "Increase my faith!"

Unity: The Church is One General Audience of Sept. 25

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In the Creed, we confess that the Church is "one". When we consider the rich diversity of languages, cultures and peoples present in the Church throughout the world, we realize that this unity is a God-given gift, grounded in our common Baptism and our sharing in the Church's one faith and sacramental life. Like a great family, we are united to all our brothers and sisters in Christ, wherever they may be. We might ask ourselves how much we appreciate and express in our daily lives, and particularly in our prayer, this reality of our unity and solidarity in the communion of the Church. The world needs our witness to God's plan for the unity, reconciliation and peace of the whole human family. Let us ask the Lord to enable us, and Christians everywhere, to work to overcome our tensions and divisions, to strive, as Saint Paul bids us, to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace (cf. Eph 4:3), and to cherish the harmony which the same Spirit creates from the richness of our diversity.



Words of the Holy Father

"Do not be afraid to aim for holiness and turn yourselves over to the love of God. Holiness does not mean performing extraordinary things but carrying out daily things in an extraordinary way – that is, with love, joy and faith."

Holiness: The Church is Holy General Audience of Oct. 2

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In the Creed, we confess our faith that the Church is "holy". But how can we say that the Church is holy when she is all too evidently made up of sinners? Saint Paul helps us to see things aright when he tells us that "Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her, to make her holy" (Eph 5:25-26). The Church is inseparably one with Christ, and the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. It is not ourselves, or our merits, which make the Church holy, but God himself, through the infinite merits of Christ's sacrifice on the Cross. God calls all of us, as sinners, to be redeemed, renewed and made holy in the communion of the Church. So the constantly welcomes everyone, even the greatest sinners, to trust in Contract made holy in the communion of the Church. So the mercy, and to encounter Christ in the sacraments of Penance and the Eucharist. Let us not be afraid to respond to Christ's call, to trust in the working of the Holy Spirit and to pray and strive for that holiness which brings true joy to our lives.
