

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Our second reading this Sunday begins: "He 'for a little while' was made 'lower than the angels,' that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone."

PASTOR'S DESK

This is a very powerful statement from the Letter to the Hebrews, Chapter 2:9-11. This refers to Jesus in His Passion and Death, who volunteered to humble Himself to suffer as we suffer as humans – sufferings to which the angels are not subject, since they are pure spirit.

Angels cannot suffer and are immortal, they do not die. But Jesus loves each of us so much that He was willing to allow Himself to be made lower than the angels, whom He created! He did this so that He might attain victory for us in His Cross. One of the results of Christ's passion was His exaltation and glorification. Therefore, if we share in His suffering and death, we will also be exalted and glorified! Because Jesus made Himself "one of us," in suffering and death, He was able to fully represent us to the Father. He could bring our cause to the Father and make full atonement to the Father. In order to fully represent any particular group with a cause, you must be "one of the group." You must be able to put forth their case because you are the same as they are, so you can speak and act on their behalf. Jesus became one of us in all things but sin.

This is why we gather to worship Him, to give Him all glory and honor. He is our Savior and Redeemer! Come let us worship, Him! See you in Church!


