Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Our Gospel Reading this Sunday is a familiar one from the Gospel of Matthew. It is the parable of the King who throws a wedding feast for his son. Those he had originally invited refused to attend. The second group he invited ignored his invitation or killed the bearers of the invitation, his servants. So the King told his servants to round up anyone they could find who would attend the banquet.

As we can easily realize the parable represent Our Lord's invitation to spend eternity with Him in Heaven. He has invited everyone to His heavenly kingdom. Just like the King in the parable, Jesus does not demand that we attend but rather respects the free will that He created us with. Many people, like those in the parable, chose to refuse, ignore or even react violently to Jesus and His invitation. Like the parable, many people are just "too busy" with their lives to even consider the invitation of Jesus. Very sad, huh?

Just like the King in the parable, Jesus provides this banquet, pre-paid, for each of us. By His suffering, death and resurrection we have a paid banquet awaiting us in Heaven. A banquet, like no other, that will continue for all eternity. This invitation to Heaven by Our Lord Jesus Christ is extended to every human being, many times through the words of others who are servants of the Lord Jesus. This is each of our call to evangelization.

As Christians have extended this invitation to all people over the last two thousand years, there have been many who accepted the invitation. However, some may have arrived at the banquet hall and found themselves unwelcome as did the King's guest not dressed in a wedding garment. All that Jesus requires of us is that we come to Heaven properly dressed.

What is this dress code? We must come dressed in holiness, sacrificial love. As St. Paul tells us, this is the one outfit that covers all that may not be proper for Heaven. Sacrificial love is the Cross. It is a death to ourselves to love God and neighbor. Clothed in this holiness we will fit in at the Heavenly Banquet with all the saints and angels.

See you in Church. Outfit yourself in holiness at the Confessional and the Altar!
