Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Words from our Scripture Readings this Sunday:

"Naaman went down and plunged into the Jordan seven times at the word of Elisha, the man of God. His flesh became again like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean of his leprosy."

"If we have died with Him we shall also live with Him; if we persevere we shall also reign with Him. But if we deny Him, He will deny us. If we are unfaithful He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself."

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

"The doctrine of the Real Presence means that Jesus is no less present in the Eucharist today than He was at the home of Martha and Mary."

In Jesus, earth and heaven became fully one, fully wed: the risen Jesus is earth taken up into heaven.



Our fleshly eyes see bread, for being of earth all they see is earth. But cloaked beneath that form of bread and wine is Jesus Christ, whose risen Body is the heart of heaven. About Him dance all the company of angels and saints in mirthful adoration. And some children of earth kneel and sit at this gate to heaven, looking up longingly through the circle of light that is heaven's heart, and while they are there, all of earth gives way like husks that yield a flower: in His presence all is peace, all is light. Why Eucharistic Adoration?

Catholicity of the Church General Audience of Oct. 9

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In the Creed, we profess that the Church is "catholic"; in other words, she is universal. We can understand this catholicity in three ways. First, the Church is catholic because she proclaims the apostolic faith in its entirety; she is the place where we meet Christ in his sacraments and receive the spiritual gifts needed to grow in holiness together with our brothers and sisters. Finally, the Church is catholic because she reconciles the wonderful diversity of God's gifts to build up his People in unity and harmony. Let us ask the Lord to make us more catholic – to enable us, like a great family, to grow together in faith and love, to draw others to Jesus in the communion of the Church, and to welcome the gifts and contributions of everyone, in order to create a joyful symphony of praise to God for his goodness, his grace, and his redemptive love.
