Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Who wants to be sad? Answer: No one. Who wants to be happy? Answer: Everyone. This is very accurately reflected in the popular usage of the Sad Face Image and the Happy Face Image. The two conditions of Man: either Happy or Sad! In today's Gospel Jesus tells the Pharisees the secret to always having a Happy Face! The irony of the situation is that their question is a product of their own unhappiness. Jesus, always loving us, even when we are trying to hurt Him, actually tells the unhappy, mean spirited Pharisees, how to be happy while answering their question. In their case, it seems that their own selfishness blinded them to seeing the truth of Jesus' answer. One of the best ways to be happy is fall in love and then be in love. I think everyone realizes this. Jesus answer gives us a way to always be happy. It is a heart that is "in love," that is happy; not an easy life, lots of money, good looks or a new car. A person "in love" is happy, or more accurately, is joyful. To be "in love" and have that love returned perfectly is to be filled with joy. It is a beautiful, joyful day, the day we fall in love and find out that the one who we love also loves us just as much, if not more! Nothing else about that day matters.

St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that sadness is a vice that comes from disordered self-love. Selfishness or a life totally centered on ourselves leads us to unhappiness and sadness. Then we become sad when all that we desire for ourselves is not fulfilled. The amount of money, possessions, education, job, marriage, health, etc., that we believe we need to be happy is never able to be realized in this world. We cannot have everything and everyone the way we want. It is impossible. So we are sad. However, we can love God, "with all our heart, with all our soul and with all our mind." And God will return our love, even more perfectly, than we love Him! Giving all our love to Jesus and forgetting about ourselves brings us a life of joy. When we are concentrating totally on serving the one we love, we are the most joyful! We forget about ourselves and our "troubles." The New Translation of our Catholic Mass will help us to focus our lives on worshiping and loving our Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The words of the new translation will reveal to us who this amazing God is and how much He loves us. See you at Mass!


