Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Three sentences strike me from this weekend's Scriptures.

Responsorial Psalm: "The Lord hears the cry of the poor."

Second Reading: "The Lord will rescue me from

every evil threat and bring me safe

to His heavenly kingdom."

"... whoever exalts himself will be Gospel Reading: humbled, and the one who humbles

himself will be exalted."

Our God is always listening for us. It is not only at particular times, places, days or seasons that He is listening, but at all times, places, days and seasons. He is the perfect, loving parent whose ears are always ready to catch our first cries. Just as new parents are always listening and sensitive to the sound of their newborn's crying, our Father in heaven is always listening for you and me.
