Letter from the Pastor

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time + 2013

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Belief in God and His promises, in particular, the resurrection of the body and the life of the world to come are foundational to our Catholic Faith and Life! In our First Reading and Gospel this Sunday we hear two very different situations but both are lived out through faith in these two fundamental teachings of our Church. In fact, they are the last two sentences of the Creed we all profess together each Sunday!

In the first reading from the Book of Maccabees this faith allows seven young brothers to hold firm in their faith despite tortures and death. They are actually able to witness the torture and death of each brother before their own death! This strength of faith is not only lived by the brothers, but also their mother, who actually encourages them to endure suffering and death rather than betray their faith.

In the Gospel we hear the story of seven more brothers who all end up married to the same woman before their deaths. The Sadducees are using this ridiculous story to try and discredit Jesus who has been teaching about the afterlife. The Sadducees denied both the immortality of the soul and the resurrection of the body.

For folks in Jesus' time, as well as you and I now, our Catholic Faith only makes livable sense if there is a resurrection and life everlasting. St. Paul states this truth so emphatically in 1 Corinthians, chapter 15, verse 14. Basically saying, there is no sense talking about all this Jesus thing, if there is no resurrection and life eternal. Then, if you think about it, why would anyone want to live the Catholic Faith? Way too many restrictions on what we really want to do and what is most convenient for us to do each day!

As always, let us ask Jesus to increase our Faith!




