Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

Only this Sunday and one more to go in this Liturgical Year! Next Sunday is the last Sunday of Liturgical Year C and it is Christ the King Sunday. The Sunday after that is the First Sunday of Advent - the First Sunday of the New Liturgical Year, which will be Sunday Cycle A.

As we near the end of our Liturgical Year the Church invites us to meditate on the end times - that future coming of the Lord Jesus Christ at the final judgment, the end of the world. What a crazy thing it is to think about. However, our Lord tells us that we need to think about it very often. By thinking about and realizing the truth of the final judgment we help ourselves detach from this world and focus on the holiness that will get us to Heaven. If we stay focused on this world it is very difficult to live a good Catholic life.

Even the work we do to live each day takes on a very different meaning in light of our Catholic Faith and the end of this world. In our second reading this weekend, St. Paul places a great emphasis on how we are to work each day. He reminds us that our daily work life is our path to holiness and Heaven. It is through the work that we do each day that we are to help ourselves and others get to Heaven.

The Catholic while working each day should seek only the glory of God and the good of others. If we truly strive to do this everyday then our work becomes an instrument of our salvation and helps lead others to Christ. We should prepare for the coming of Christ at the end of time by sanctifying our daily work.

It is in our workplace that we are able to grow in charity, understanding, helpfulness, diligence and perseverance. By bringing grace into our lives through the Sacraments we are better able to cooperate with Christ in His redemptive work on earth. We should not let a day pass by that we are not aware of the great privilege we have in cooperating with God's plan for salvation, both for ourselves and others.
