

The Battle of Lepanto

In the year 1571, Christianity was under threat of being overrun by the Islamic

Ottoman Empire. The Catholic nations of Venice, Spain, the Papal States, Genoa, Savoy, and Malta gathered together a fleet to face the Ottoman threat. The pope, St. Pius V, called on all of Christian Europe to pray the rosary that the fleet of this Holy League would be able to prevent the Ottoman Turks from carrying out their expansion into Europe. One of the commanders of the Catholic fleet, Andrea Doria, carried a **copy of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe** into battle with him. The Christians were victorious, with 210 of the 286 Ottoman ships being either sunk or captured. The Christian fleet lost only 50 of their 212 ships. The pope, hundreds of miles away at the time, is said to have gotten up in the middle of a meeting and said, "The Christian fleet is victorious!" shedding tears of gratitude. The date of the battle, October 7, became the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary as the victory and the salvation of Christian Europe was due to her intercession.

Advent

39. Advent has a twofold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight.

42. ... The liturgical color for Advent is purple, just like Lent—as both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Also Advent (like Lent) includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas. ...


Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the General Roman Calendar

BLESSING OF AN ADVENT WREATH

The Advent wreath is made of four candles and a circle of branches. Before the first candle is lighted, the household gathers for this blessing.

All make the sign of the cross. The leader begins:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All respond:

Who made heaven and earth.

The leader may use these or similar words to introduce the blessina.

In the short days and long nights of Advent, we realize how we are always waiting for deliverance, always needing salvation by our God. Around this wreath, we shall remember God's promise.

Then the Scripture is read:

Listen to the words of the prophet Isaiah:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing.

Isaiah 9:1-2

(The family's Bible may be used for an alternate reading, such Isaiah 63:16-17 or Isaiah 64:2-7.)

The reader concludes:

The Word of the Lord.

All respond:

Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, all join in prayers of intercession and the the Lord's Prayer.

Then the leader invites:

Let us now pray for God's blessings upon us and upon this wreath.

After a short silence, the leader prays:

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R. Amen.

The first candle is then lighted.

The leader says:

Let us bless the Lord.

All respond, making the sign of the cross:

Thanks be to God.

The blessing concludes with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations, bind In one the hearts of humankind;

Bid ev'ry sad divisions cease

And by thyself our Prince of peace.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel

Shall come to thee, O Israel.

Each day in Advent, perhaps at the evening meal the candles are lighted: one candle the first week, two the second, and so forth.

Prayers for Each Week

FIRST WEEK The following prayer should be repeated each day during the first week.

Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, and come, That by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The first purple candle is lit and allowed to burn during evening meals for the first week.

SECOND WEEK *The prayer that follows is to be* repeated each day of the second week.

Leader: O Lord, stir up our hearts that we may prepare for Thy only begotten Son, that through His coming we may be made worthy to serve Thee with pure minds. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Two purple candles are lit and allowed to burn during the evening meals of the second week.

THIRD WEEK The joyful Sunday in Advent (known as Gaudete') is represented by rose (or pink) instead of the penitential purple color. Each night during the third week the pink, as well as the two previously burned purple candles, are lit after the following prayer has been said.

Leader: O Lord, we beg Thee, incline Thy ear to our prayers and enlighten the darkness of our minds by the grace of Thy visitation. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The three candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the third week.

FOURTH WEEK The prayer that follows is to be repeated each day of the fourth week.

Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy power, we pray Thee, and come; and with great might help us, that with the help of Thy Grace, Thy merciful forgiveness may hasten what our sins impede. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

All four candles are lit and allowed to burn during the evening meals of the fourth week.
