PASTOR'S MESSAGE

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

November 26, 2017

This last Sunday of Ordinary Time, the 34th Sunday of Ordinary Time, reminds us of who we truly, in reality, are. The first lines of our first reading from the Prophet Ezekiel says:

Thus says the Lord GOD:

I myself will look after and tend my sheep.

As a shepherd tends his flock

when he finds himself among his scattered sheep,

so will I tend my sheep.

I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered

when it was cloudy and dark.

I myself will pasture my sheep;

If we make HIM our King. King of EVERY part of our life. He will personally shepherd us into life and give it abundantly!

The hard part is truly making HIM King. We, often without bad intention, put all kinds of things ahead of Him and block His ability to give us a life. He always respects our free will/choice. This is why He tells us that nothing must be taken automatically as His will. All aspects of our life must be discerned to make His will known and acted upon.

“If anyone comes to Me, and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple.”

We automatically think some things and ways are His will, and don't even bother to discern His will. He tells us, “You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions.”

As we get ready to begin a new Church year, let us pray and discern His Will. Not automatically taking anything for granted as being His Will for us.

End of Year Giving

Consistent with Internal Revenue Service regulations, all year end gifts must be postmarked with a 2017 date to be recorded as a gift in 2017. The postmark on the envelope will determine what year the gift is recorded in. Examples for clarification are listed below:

- **If we receive a gift with a check dated 12/31/2017 on 1/3/2018, but the postmark on the envelope reads 12/31/2017 (or earlier) then we will post the date of the gift as 12/31/2017.**
- **If we receive a gift with a check dated 12/31/2017, but the postmark of the envelope reads 1/1/2018 (or later) then it will be posted as a gift received in 2018.**

We will also record all hand delivered gifts received at the office on **Dec. 31, 2017 by noon** as a 2017 gift.
