"The early Mexican historian Ixtlilxochitl estimates that one out of every five children in Mexico was sacrificed. It is known that entire tribes, numbering in the tens of thousands, were on several occasions exterminated by sacrifice." (p. 8)

In what is now Mexico City in the year 1487 (five years before Columbus discovered the Americas), there was human sacrifice around the clock for four days and four nights. A new victim was sacrificed to the Aztec gods every fifteen seconds. By the end, more than 80,000 men were killed. (p. 10)
