SPONSOR OF THE WEEK: THE WILDFLOWER CAFE



Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,
As we bring to a close our Catholic Liturgical Year and open a new year with the First Sunday of Advent, we need to be thinking of our Faith in terms of both an end and beginning. Our celebration, remembering Christmas which happened over two thousand years ago, must remind us of the fulfillment of the Lord's first promise and the still to arrive, fulfillment of His second promise.

As we know from history, most folks were not ready nor expecting His arrival. For thousands of years the prophets, who we will hear during this Advent Season, had been proclaiming that He would come. Their Savior, the Messiah, would come to save His people. But folks were living as if this promise was not going to be fulfilled. They were busy about the life they were living in this world and not preparing to receive Him when He came. St. Paul says in Romans 13:11, "He came unto His own and His own received Him not."

The Church gives us this four week time of preparation, not to celebrate Christmas, which has already happened in history. Rather, it is to be prepared to see, recognize and receive Him for the next "Advents" of God – first when we die, and then again at the end of the world.

St. Luke advises us in today's Gospel, "Beware that our hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap."

St. John tells us in his letter that the main obstacles which keep us away from Him, that obstruct and hinder the growth of our Christian life, are: "the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the pride of life." (1)John 2:16

Let us all enter this Advent Season with a true desire and practical spiritual plan to "ready ourselves" for the next coming of the Lord Jesus. One of the best beginnings for this plan is to spend some time in prayer and preparation for a good Advent Confession. A thorough examination of conscience followed by a sincere Confession will get us off to a good start in our Advent spirituality.




