Consistent with Internal Revenue Service regulations, all year end gifts must be postmarked with a 2017 date to be recorded as a gift in 2017. The postmark on the envelope will determine what year the gift is recorded in. Examples for clarification are listed below:

- If we receive a gift with a check dated 12/31/2017 on 1/3/2018, but the postmark on the envelope reads 12/31/2017 (or earlier) then we will post the date of the gift as 12/31/2017.
- If we receive a gift with a check dated 12/31/2017, but the postmark of the envelope reads 1/1/2018 (or later) then it will be posted as a gift received in 2018.

We will also record all hand delivered gifts received at the office on **Dec. 31, 2017 by noon** as a 2017 gift.

And Jesus answered him: Truly, I say to you, there is no man who has left house or wife or brothers or parents or children for the sake of the Kingdom of God, who will not receive manifold more in this time, and in the age to come eternal life.

How will he, who takes into account the least of our actions, be able to forget the faithfulness of one day after another? He who multiplied the loaves and fishes for the crowds that followed him for a few days, what will he not do for those who have left all to follow him always? If these should one day beg from him a special grace to keep moving forward, how could Jesus deny them? He is a good paymaster.

God gives a hundredfold for each thing left behind for love of him. Furthermore, whoever follows Jesus in this way is not only enriched a hundredfold in this life, but is also predestined to a reward the munificence of which beggars the imagination. At the end he will hear the voice of Jesus, whom he has served all his life: Come, O blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. On hearing these words of welcome into eternity, generosity will have been well recompensed.
