Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

On this Second Sunday of our Advent Season we continue to hear the Prophet Isaiah proclaim the Good News! He is coming! The long awaited Messiah! Our Savior!

Alive as Catholic Christians in the Year of Our Lord, 2010, we celebrate His Birthday, remembering that first Christmas....but we also await His Second Coming at the end of time.

So the words of St. John the Baptist still apply to each of us every day of our lives: "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!" Like the stewardess tells us as we prepare to takeoff, ". . . place the oxygen mask over your face then help someone else with theirs." This is the work of St. John the Baptist! We help to prepare the way of the Lord Jesus into the lives of others, by our witness to Jesus. Those whom we cannot help personally we prepare by our prayer and sacrifice for them, especially for those closest to us.
