Pastor's Message

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time + 2016

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

The reading from the Book of Nehemiah recounts the return of the Chosen People to the land of Israel after years of exile in Babylon. If we ask the Holy Spirit to assist us in the reading/hearing, we experience the powerful emotions of the Israelite people.

Ezra, the priest, reads from the law of God. The people have forgotten much of this or it has become a distant memory during the many years in a foreign land. The Holy Spirit places in their hearts the fullness of the words of God they are hearing with their ears. They are open to something new, or something old that was forgotten or taken away from them.

They "bowed down and prostrated themselves before the Lord, their faces to the ground." The words of love from their God overpowered everything else. The people began weeping as the law was proclaimed and explained to them. Their weeping was in repentance for the neglect of the Law that led to their exile. Their sins against God had allowed their enemies to triumph over them.

Ezra recognized this as good but also moved them on to a new realization. Sorrowful weeping and repentance are good only if it leads us to a joy in a new life lived according to God's Law.

Ezra said to them, "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drink, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; for today is holy to our Lord. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength!"

Let us Rejoice in the Lord and His loving Law together, celebrating the Mass.

People are wounded by the world's illusions...








Candlemas and The Presentation of the Lord

On Feb. 2 every year, the Church celebrates the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. In keeping with Jewish law, Jesus was presented to God in the Temple as a recognition of the sovereignty of God and of children as a gift from God. When Jesus was presented in the Temple, the fact that He was the Messiah was recognized by the holy Simeon and Anna. Traditionally, this feast is celebrated with a blessing of candles and a lighted procession, and this is how it got its traditional name—Candlemas, short for "Candle-Mass."

We will have the blessing of the candles after all Masses on Jan. 30 & 31st and after the Tuesday Masses on Feb. 2.
