Pastor's Message

Third Sunday In Ordinary Time + 2015

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, He repented of the evil He had threatened to do to them; He did not carry it out."

"For the world in its present form is passing away."

"The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

These three quotes are taken from our readings this Sunday. The first from the Book of the Prophet Jonah, the second from Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians and the last from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark.

- 1. If we are not living God's way now, but change our ways, God will forgive us and not hold it against us.
- 2. The wrong way we were living is not even going to be an option in the future. We might as well change now and have a future.
- 3. The future is the Kingdom of God, the way it is told in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

As simple as it seems, these three points pretty well set forth our lives as Catholic Christians. It effectively reduces volumes upon volumes of theology and spirituality to a practical way of looking at our lives now and in the future after we die, and/or the world comes to an end, whichever happens first.

These three Scripture Readings are great to spend some time meditating upon in front of Jesus in our Perpetual Adoration Chapel. Give it a try!
