PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion + 2016

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

In our Liturgy this Sunday we experience a very powerful mix of conflicting emotions. Jesus rides into Jerusalem amid the triumphant singing and shouting of His people. They have found their Messiah and are accompanying Him into the great city of Jerusalem. Here, they believe, He will establish His Kingdom on earth a free them from the domination of Rome.

Jesus visibly fulfills the prophesy of Zechariah 9:9: "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and riding on an ass, on a colt the foal of an ass."

As this joyous, triumphant procession makes it way from the top of the Mount of Olives and begins to descend the western slope towards the Temple in Jerusalem, we witness a different scene. When Jesus sees the Temple and the City of Jerusalem below Him, He begins to weep.....everything changes. Jesus sees the depth of sin, ignorance and blindness the people have fallen into. He experiences in Himself their closed hearts to the salvation He is offering. Looking into the future, just a few years, He sees the city and the temple destroyed and razed to the ground.

We each need to pause and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to us what Jesus is seeing in our lives and world this Palm Sunday. As we fall on our knees during the Consecration, when He becomes present, we should ask Him to free us from the hardness of heart and unbelief we have so that we might experience His salvation this Easter.

An Adoration Testimony

I would like you give you guys my experience on adoration. I've never been able to commit to a permanent spot in the chapel because of my work schedule but until recently I have subbed for family a couple of times. I'm now home on maternity leave and this has allowed me to share a time with another adorer and sub more often. At first it was a chore. I hated setting an alarm for 1:40am on Saturdays, dragging myself out of bed and I felt like I was just "keeping watch" for an hour until I was relieved of my duties.

I wasn't focused during that hour or even praying. My brain wandered, constantly looking at the clock. Then it started to remind me of why people say they left the Catholic Church. All too often I've heard "I didn't get anything out of it" and then we as practicing Catholics ask "what are you putting into it?"

And that was my answer. I wasn't even making an effort during my "watch hour". I started listening to a rosary app on my phone followed by worship music. I've found myself listening to the words and coming out of adoration with questions. Even though I'm what some would refer to as a "cradle Catholic" and attended Catholic school all 13 years, I feel like so much more has been unlocked for me recently. I'm so eager to learn about our faith and I love when people ask me

questions and I don't have the answer. It's another opportunities I get to discover and learn.

Holy Thursday, March 24 Mass of the Lord's Supper

With the celebration of Mass on the evening of Holy Thursday "the Church begins the Easter Triduum, and recalls the Last Supper, in which the Lord Jesus, on the night He was betrayed, loving unto the end His own who were in the world, He offered to the Father His Body and Blood under the species of bread and wine and gave them to the Apostles as spiritual nourishment, and He commanded them and their successors in the priesthood to perpetuate this offering."

The mysteries which are commemorated in the Holy Thursday Mass are the institution of the Eucharist, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the institution of our Catholic Priesthood, and Christ's command of brotherly love exemplified in the washing of the feet.

After the transfer of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose there is no Mass celebrated in any Church throughout the world until the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil. The tabernacle is empty, His Real Presence is removed from the body of our Churches to an Altar of Repose and Adoration.

Good Friday Celebration of the Lord's Passion

Friday, March 25

On this day, when "Christ our Passover was sacrificed," the Church meditates on the Passion of her Lord and Spouse, venerates the Cross, commemorates her origin from the side of Christ on the Cross and intercedes for the salvation of the whole world.

On this day, in accordance with ancient tradition, the Church does not celebrate the Eucharist; Holy Communion is distributed to the faithful during the celebration of the Lord's Passion alone, though it may be brought at any time of the day to the sick.

The general intercessions follow a wording and form handed down by ancient tradition, maintaining the full range of intentions, so as to signify clearly the universal effect of the Passion of Christ, who hung on the Cross for the salvation of the whole world.

Holy Saturday

On Holy Saturday the Church is as it were at the Lord's tomb, meditating on His passion and death and on His descent into Hell, and awaiting His resurrection with prayer and fasting. To enter more fully into the Triduum, it is recommended that the Good Friday fast be extended through Holy Saturday. On this day the Church abstains strictly from the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass. Holy Communion may be given only in the form of Viaticum.

The Easter Vigil

According to a most ancient tradition, the night before Easter Sunday is "one of vigil for the Lord," and the Vigil celebrated during it, to commemorate that holy night when the Lord rose from the dead, is regarded as the "Mother of all Holy Vigils," for in that night the Church keeps vigil, waiting for the Resurrection of the Lord and celebrates the Sacraments of Christian Initiation.

night. It should not begin before nightfall; it should end before daybreak on Sunday." This rule is to be taken according to its strictest sense.

The Passover Vigil, in which the Hebrews kept watch for the Lord's Passover which was to free them from slavery to Pharaoh, was an annual commemoration. It prefigured the true Pasch of Christ that was to come, the night that is of true liberation, in which "destroying the bonds of death, Christ rose as victor from the depths."

Easter Sunday

Since on it we celebrate the resurrection of the Lord from the dead and the opening of heaven to us, we hold Easter as the holiest day of the year. This is the day for which we wait and long all of Lent and all year.

Divine Mercy Novena

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on **Good Friday**. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:

"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

Those who do not believe in Jesus & those who do not yet know Him

DAY 5 (Easter Tuesday)

The souls of separated brethren

DAY 6 (Easter Wednesday)

The meek and humble souls and the souls of children

DAY 7 (Easter Thursday)

The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy

DAY 8 (Easter Friday)

The souls who are detained in purgatory;

DAY 9 (Easter Saturday)

The souls who have become luke warm.
