Pastor's Message

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion + 2015

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

"Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet Him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out: Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy! Let Him enter, the King of Glory!"

Let us pray this devotion together as family on Divine Mercy Sunday April 12th @ 3pm in the Church

The message and devotion to Jesus as **The Divine Mercy** is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

The message of mercy is that God loves us — all of us — no matter how great our sins. He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. It is a message we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC.

A— Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

B— Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us

C— Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

Tell souls about this great mercy of Mine, because the awful day, the day of My justice, is near. (Diary965)





A Season of Penance, A Season of Joy

For forty days we observe the holy and penitential season of Lent. During this time we focus on our need for God and for how far we still have to go in turning our lives over to Him fully. This makes the arrival of Easter even sweeter at the end of this time of penance.

To experience the fullness of the renewal that was won by Christ, that is brought to us in the sacraments, and that is completed in our coming life in heaven, we celebrate the Holy Triduum—the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday that culminate in the glorious Easter

Vigil and Easter Sunday. Taking part in all of the liturgies of these days is a good way to enter into and experience the truth of the Faith and of Redemption in a powerful way.

But it doesn't stop there.


Easter Day is such an important day that we can't confine our celebration of it to just one day. We celebrate Easter Day for eight days, an Octave. Going to Mass on these days, resting from unnecessary work, and treating these days as holy days is a great way of expressing our joy in the Resurrection of Christ and of

anticipating the fullness of joy that we will experience in our resurrection on the Last Day.

But it doesn't stop there.

Even after the Octave of Easter, we continue to celebrate Easter season for 50 days from Easter Sunday until that other great holy day, Pentecost, when we commemorate the descent of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the Apostles and the birth of the Church. Thus, the penitential season leads us to a season of celebration. The Passion of the Lord leads to His Resurrection. And our penance leads to joy.
