As the Father sent me, so I send you.

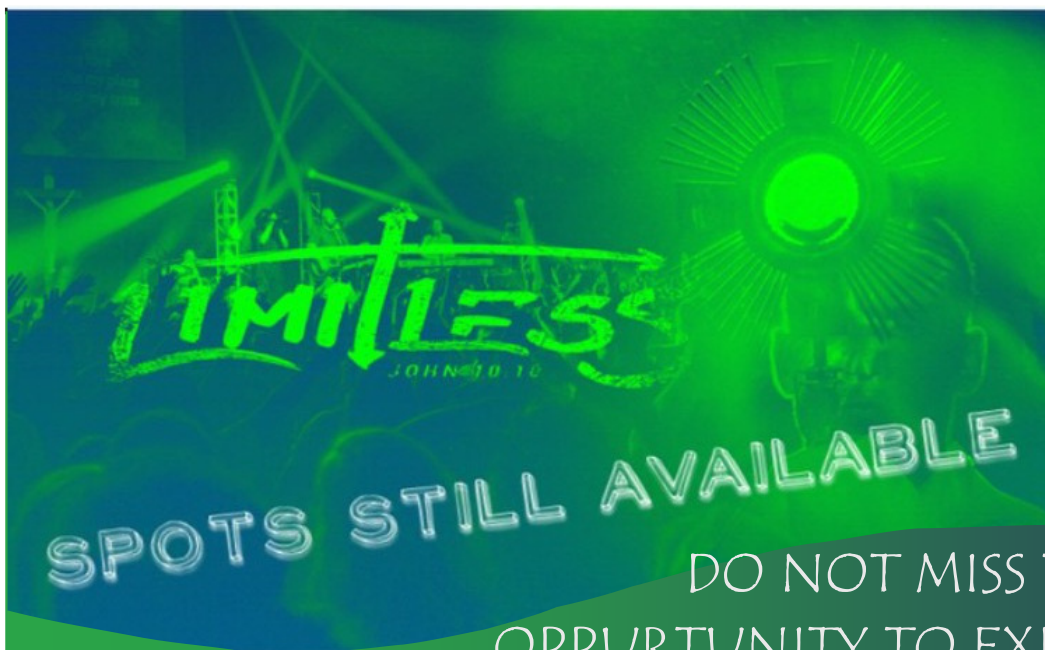
Dear St. John Nepomucene Parishioners,
I am writing to thank you again for your generous donations to my **mission trip to Romania**. We arrived back with heavy hearts because we were so **sad to leave the children**. There were about 40 students from 5 different teams going to different locations in Romania and Slovakia. My team had 12 people and we went to a large city in Romania called Baia Mare. There is a daycare center there called Sacro Core (Sacred Heart) that is run by Nuns and teenage volunteers. The day care is attached to a bakery, so it always smells like sweets. Our team spent 4 days at Sacro Core. The children did not have school that week because they were off for Easter. In Romania, they are Byzantine Catholics, and their Easter comes a week later than ours. We got to play with the children during the mornings and afternoons. One day we went on a hike and taught them how to pray the chaplet of Divine Mercy. They were all so sweet and just wanted to be loved. Claudia, the lady who works and lives at Sacro Core, told us that **the kids do not come from good homes**. The whole idea behind the daycare was to give the children a place with structured days and to teach them how to be good people. The volunteers help with homework, play games with the children, serve them meals, and make sure they brush their teeth afterwards. I could tell that the children loved going there. **The teenage volunteers loved it too**. During the evenings, our team would give chastity talks and witnessings, to teach the teens the value of their bodies. After small group sessions, **we would invite them to come to Mass with us**. There was a small chapel in a room above the dining room there, and the Franciscan priest who came with us, Fr. Matt, would say Mass in English while Claudia translated. The teens really seemed to like it, even though our Roman rite was foreign to them. **I think our team had a big impact on the teens**, because they looked up to us as young Americans who were proclaiming the Gospel of

Christ. However, I do not think anyone on my team expected the impact those teens would have on us. If there was only thing I took away from the mission, it would be this: we went as missionaries to give to those in need, but we realized we were the ones in need of those we were ministering to. What I mean is that my mission team needed those children and teenagers to make us better people to love like Christ loves, we need to give, but we cannot give when no one is there. Going on mission gave us the opportunity to give to others, so we could love our brothers and sisters like Christ loves us. I will take the memory of this mission trip with me for the rest of my life. I have learned and grown so much. Thank you again for supporting me.
