Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time + 2015

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

What a weekend! Those of you who viewed the Steubenville South video at Mass last weekend, can agree with that statement. The Steubenville South Conference in Alexandria, Louisiana was again an awesome experience. Being present to watch the Lord Jesus work in the hearts, souls and bodies of our St. John Teens is great for me. It is a very practical experience of the everyday love our God has for His children.

During the 60 hours of the weekend over 3,000 Catholic High School Teens enter into the full Sacramental (Jesus) life of our Faith/Church. In the gentle, loving, forgiving Sacrament of Confession they are able to "let go" of the shame, guilt and hurt of their sins. Letting go they can then experience the true joy and freedom of Jesus' mercy, love and healing. The freedom of chains being broken and hearts healed.

They hear the Gospel, the Living Word, proclaimed at Mass as they prepare to encounter the Sacrifice of Calvary on the Altar at the Consecration. Kneeling before the Sacrificial Altar our teens are able to give to Jesus their joys, sorrows, problems, questions and hurts. They experience the Holy Spirit that flows from the Father in Heaven as Jesus takes their "stuff" from the Altar and presents it to His Father in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Anointing of the Sick

Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."



The Sacrament of Anointing the Sick is the modern version of what was once the Last Rites. Today, the Church offers everyone struggling with illness and suffering the healing comfort of sacramental anointing. Seek this sacrament if any of the following conditions are true:

- If you are seriously ill.
- If you are scheduled for surgery.
- If you are seeking emotional healing.
- If you have a chronic illness or pain.
- If you are elderly or in fragile health.
- If you are depressed or grieving.
- If you are in danger of death.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A ... surgery or illness is sufficient. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. A person should be anointed before surgery ... (cf. Rite of Anointing, Introduction, nos. 8-10).

Moreover, "old people may be anointed if they are in weak condition even though no dangerous illness is present. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be comforted by this sacrament. . . . [The faithful] should be encouraged to ask for the anointing, and, as soon as the time for the anointing comes, to receive it with faith and devotion, not misusing the sacrament by putting it off" (Rite of Anointing, nos. 11, 12, 13). 
